Early Head Start

Early Head Start is a FREE child development program for families with children ages birth-to-36 months, as well as pregnant mothers and their families. Families must qualify based on their income and live in Utah County.

Early Head Start partners with parents and supports them as they help their young children grow and develop. Positive, nurturing parent-child interactions are the focus of all services and activities.

Through observation, education, and planning with parents, Early Head Start helps families work with their child on school readiness and family literacy. We also support families who have children with disabilities. Some of our services include weekly home visits, family activities, parent-child socialization and special groups for dads.

Services address all aspects of parenting and child development, including:

- ◆ *Health, Safety and Nutrition*
- ◆ *Social and Emotional Development*
- ◆ *Physical Growth and Mental Wellness*
- ◆ *Movement and Music*
- ◆ *Parent-Child Relationships*

All Early Head Start services are FREE to enrolled families. Apply with the attached form or call 801-221-9930 ext. 131 to discuss eligibility.



Early Intervention

Early Intervention provides support and services to families with children under age three who have developmental delays or disabilities. Families must reside in Alpine School District boundaries, and have a child with significant delay in one or more areas of cognitive development.

Early Intervention is the process of anticipating, identifying and responding to concerns about a child's development to minimize potential adverse effects and maximize healthy development. Our focus is helping parents build skills to promote the child's development into their daily routines.

Our services are provided primarily through home visits by certified and licensed professionals. Services may be provided in our Orem or Lehi centers. Services are individualized to specific needs and may include:

- ◆ *FREE Child Assessment*
- ◆ *Individualized Family Service Plan*
- ◆ *Parent Classes and Seminars*
- ◆ *Physical and Occupational Therapy*
- ◆ *Speech and Language Services*
- ◆ *Assistive Technology*
- ◆ *Nutritional Services*

A small monthly fee may be charged based on family income. Services will not be denied based on inability to pay. If you are concerned about your child's development, return the attached form or call 801-221-9930 ext. 163 to set up a FREE developmental assessment.



Bridges

Bridges is our newest program designed to help families and children over three years old who are living with Autism Spectrum Disorders or similar delays. Formal diagnosis of the child is not required to access services. Bridges provides services that are practical, flexible, and affordable.

Our Philosophy: Parents are a child's most important asset and have a lasting impact on the success of their child's development. We enhance this role by providing training and support not only for the child, but also to the parents and family.

Our Services: Families choose from a combination of research-based therapies to best fit the needs of the individual child. All services empower the parent in building a lasting foundation of learning and skills in their child. Services may include:

- ◆ *Preschool and Social Groups*
- ◆ *Kindermusik with Autism Focus*
- ◆ *Floortime Class Series*
- ◆ *Parent University Courses*
- ◆ *Toy Lending*
- ◆ *In-Home Visits*
- ◆ *Home-based Training and Development*
