## INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

*Kids On The Move provides several internship opportunities each semester. These are great opportunities for students to become more familiar with resources and agencies in the community, understand better how a nonprofit organization works, and have an opportunity to gain experience working with parents that have young children. Most internships are unpaid, however there are a few opportunities each year for a paid internship with a small stipend.*

### **Early Intervention Intern** *May include a paid stipend.*

Early Intervention interns work closely with parent-child playgroups and other program services for parents who have infants and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Early Intervention interns co-facilitate parent-child playgroups that provide developmentally appropriate play opportunities and parent support.

Other opportunities to learn more about and observe services are available, such as participating in home visits, parenting classes, and supporting sibling services for siblings of children with special needs.

### **Child Care Center Intern** *May include a paid stipend.*

The Child Care Center intern works as a classroom aid working directly with children enrolled in the Child Care Center at Kids On The Move.

The Center is a high quality child care site that provides educational activities to children birth to five. The Child Care Center intern plans developmentally appropriate activities for children in care and works with other volunteers to provide children with fun and interactive experiences for children.

### **Nonprofit Management/Public Relations/ Finance Internships**

These internships are for those interested in working with administrative and management projects for a local nonprofit organization. Interns will have an opportunity to work with aspects of public relations, fundraising, research, finance and accounting, and quality improvement.

### **Early Head Start Intern**

This EHS Parent Involvement & Administrative internship supports services and activities that serve low-income parents of infants and toddlers. The Parent Involvement and Administrative intern plays a major role in supporting the planning and implementation of family activities for those enrolled in the program.

This is a hands-on internship that provides experience in many areas of the Early Head Start program both in direct service and administrative functions. Spanish speaking skills are helpful but not necessary.

### **Bridges Autism Intern**

The Bridges intern works as a classroom aid working directly with children enrolled in the Bridges Program at Kids On The Move. They would also be other program services for parents who have children with autism or similar delays.
